

# Essential Skills Training and Pathways to Successful Careers for Indigenous Peoples

**Culture, Confidence, and Competence (CCC) program** is an essential skills workforce training program designed by and for Indigenous women and gender diverse people. The cultural foundation of this innovative program supports a journey of self-reflection, career exploration and skill building experiences that prepare members to obtain and retain jobs across multiple employment sectors and to become entrepreneurs. Members in the CCC develop individualized training plans and are streamed into worksite placements, jobs or other relevant referral agencies. A training allowance and wraparound supports e.g., childcare, technology, and transportation are offered to reduce barriers to participation. Co-ed training programs are offered at the request of communities through ISETS partnerships.
